#### **ITINERARY**

#### Friday September 27 – leave Club for Royal Victoria Yacht Club.

Early Birds may join in to raft up and enjoy 1 pm lunch together off Sydney Spit. Look for Swell Skimmer!

We will use a reciprocal to stay at the Royal Vic. Take advantage of showers and great facilities! Weather permitting,5 pm Happy Hour on the dock, followed by 6-ish dinner at the Club; plan to meet in Club lounge. If weather is inclement, then Happy Hour in Club lounge prior to dinner.

The sooner you register, the better our chances of advising Royal Vic the number in our fleet and increasing the probability that all of us can be accommodated as reciprocals.

#### Saturday Tie-up in the Shadow of the Empress Hotel and Bird Cage:

Saturday morning we will leave the RVYC after an early breakfast and head for the Inner Harbour's Causeway Marina of the Greater Victoria Harbour Authority. You will have to book this well in advance. ## Saturday morning holds two choices that are two blocks from each other, and a 15 minute walk from the Inner Harbour.

Choice # 1: The Art Gallery of Greater Victoria, 1040 Moss St, which opens at 10 am is featuring the exhibition 'Generations'. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to explore one of Canada's most legendary private collections. It is organized and presented by the McMichael Gallery of Kleinberg, Ontario. *Generations: The Sobey Family and Canadian Art* tells the story of one family's visionary engagement with Canadian and Indigenous art, braiding together works by early European newcomers like Cornelius Krieghoff; titans of Canadian 20th century art, the Group of Seven, Tom Thomson, David Milne and Emily Carr; a rich display of works by the Quebec Impressionists, as well as Automatiste painters Jean Paul Riopelle and Paul-Émile Borduas; and works by trail-blazing artists of today, including contemporary Indigenous artists Kent Monkman, Brenda Draney, Brian Jungen and Annie Pootoogook, as well as leading international artist Peter Doig. A recurring theme in the exhibition is the North Atlantic, its role in history, and its impact on artists' imaginations. Admission rate \$15; free for those 25 and under, Indigenous Peoples and support workers.

Choice #2: For those whose interests are steeped in liveable art made of bricks, mortar, wood and glass, the Wentworth Villa Architectural Heritage Museum (1156 Fort Street) has a treat with a Saltspring connection: From the Ground, Into the Light: Organic Architecture of the Islands, 1950-2000 features works of Hank Schubart, John DiCastri, Ron Thom, and Ric Hunter. Drawing from the design philosophies of architects such as Louis Sullivan (1856-1924) and Frank Lloyd Wright (1867-1959), the term organic architecture implies a focused intention to assimilate a building into the natural environment in which it is located. The four houses featured in this exhibit all display this characteristic in innovative ways that were definitive of their time and place among the islands of the Salish Sea of coastal British Columbia. This expo examines one house designed by each of these architects and considers how each was executed

using local materials, how they enhance the natural beauty of their respective settings, interconnects inner and outer spaces, and harmoniously incorporates built-ins and other design elements of the Organic School in the context of our unique Southern Gulf Islands. Admission rates: Regular \$10, Senior \$8, Student \$6.

# Saturday afternoon 2 pm: Discover the Past guided historic walking tour of Old Town, Chinatown, and around the harbour.

Victoria is next door to us yet how much do we know about it? Find out about the city's First Nations origins, its fur trade and gold rush periods and how it has evolved over time. Specify the Saturday, September 28 'Victoria's Story' tour starting at 2:00 pm. This tour starts outside the Visitor Info Centre, 812 Wharf Street at Government Street and usually ends in Chinatown.

Victoria's Story is a leisurely 90-minute walk through Downtown Victoria. The professional guides are passionate about Victoria's history and breathe life into their stories. Iconic architecture, fascinating details about local events that link to world themes, famous and colorful people from the past are all included. By the end of your tour, you will know why Victoria is here, how it became the capital city and what the current civic issues are.
